1905 - 1929

The following information was compiled from different sources

The parsonage was across the road on the southeast corner of the intersection and was moved to the Raymond Hammelman property south of the Church, about a half mile, on the west side of the road on a farm

Plautz tore the Church down and Clarence Balster used the lumber to build a building

John Cordes was an Elder

Henry Eilers mowed the lawn - Ethel (Stern) Eilers was Henry's Wife and Ethel's Father was Henry Stern

Stern's and Hammelman's owned the Cemetery ground and are buried at the Cemetery

The railroad was to go through the Cemetery

Last Trustees were: Herman Balster  
Onke M. Hilener  
John Cordes

Last Pastor was Rev. Krebs

Church shown in plat-books of 1872 and 1922

In 1908 there were 50 families

Services were in German

The Church closed in October of 1929

Lester Dombroski was baptized at East Genesee Church
